#### **ORDINANCE 2022:14**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 15 "BUILDINGS AND CONSTRUCTION", CHAPTER 15.04 "CONSTRUCTION CODE ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT", SECTION 15.04.100 ENTITLED "FEES" OF THE CODE FOR THE BOROUGH OF STRATFORD, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Stratford is a municipal corporation organized and operating under the laws of the State of New Jersey; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Stratford Construction Official has made a recommendation to bring the Construction Code Fees up-to-date; and

**WHEREAS,** in response to the recommendation of the Borough of Stratford Construction Official it is necessary to amend Title 15 "Buildings and Construction", Chapter 15.04 "Construction Code Administration and Enforcement", Section 15.04.100 entitled "Fees",

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** by Mayor and Council of the Borough of Stratford, County of Camden, State of New Jersey that the following is the amended Section 15.04.100.

#### **SECTION 1.**

Chapter 15.04 of the Code of the Borough of Stratford, entitled "Construction Code Administration and Enforcement", Section 15.04.100 entitled "Fees", is hereby amended as follows:

#### 15.04.100 Fees.

A. Construction permit fees. The minimum fee will be eighty dollars (\$80.) for a construction permit shall be the sum of the subcode fees listed in subsections A.1 through A.5. The maximum fee for a construction

permit shall be the sum of the subcode fees listed in subsections A.1 through A.5, and subsection C. shall be paid before the permit is issued.

- 1. The building subcode fee shall be:
  - a. Use groups: B, E, H-1, H-2, H-3, H-4, I-1, I-2, I-3, M, R-1, R-2, R-3, R-5 and U, shall be \$0.045 per cubic foot of building or structure volume; minimum fee: \$250.
    - 1. Garden type sheds
      - a. Over 201 square feet; minimum fee: \$250.

b.

- b. Use groups: A-1, A-2, A-3, A-4, A-5, F-1, F-2, S-1 and S-2, \$0.030 per cubic foot of building or structure volume; minimum fee: \$250.
- c. New construction that cannot be computed by volume.

- 2. Renovations, alterations, repairs, and minor work: \$35. per \$1,000. of the estimated cost of the work; minimum fee: \$80.
  - a. Open deck structures:

Size (square feet)	Minimum Fee
Under 100 square feet	\$80.
100 to 200 square feet	\$150.
201 to 400 square feet	\$200.
401 square feet and greater	\$250.

- b. Handicapped fees. Pursuant to the authority under N.J.S.A. 52:27D-12e, no construction permit fee shall be required for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, improvement or repair of a structure and related devices installed or erected for the purpose of promoting accessibility by the handicapped, "handicapped" being defined under N.J.S.A. 51-27d-126e, and conforming to the current N.J.A.C. 5:23.7 Barrier Free Code, and any subsequent amendments or additions thereto. "Waiving of the fees" in no way "waives" the right of the enforcing agency to request plans for the purpose of reviewing plans for code compliance.
- 3. Additions: \$0.038 per cubic foot of building or structure volume for the added portion; minimum fee of \$250.

- 4. Carports: \$80.
- 5. Fees for combinations of renovations and additions shall be computed separately in accordance with Subsection A 1 c.
- 6. Demolition and removal permit fees.
  - a. The fee for demolition or removal permit shall be \$100. for a structure of less than 5,000 square feet in area and less than 30 feet in height, for one or two-family dwellings, Use Group R-3 and R-5; the fee for all other use groups shall be \$170.
  - c. Removal of a building or structure from one lot to another or to a new location on the same lot: for the new foundations and for the placement in a completed condition in the new location: \$100.
- 7. Fee for tents, in excess of 900 square feet or more than 30 feet on any dimension, shall be \$150.
- 8. Fees for retaining walls shall be as follows:
  - a. The fee for a retaining wall with a surface area greater than 550 square feet that is associated with Class 3 Residential shall be \$275.
  - b. The fee for a retaining wall with a surface area 550 square feet or less that is associated with a Class 3 Residential structure shall be \$150; and
  - c. The fee for a newly constructed retaining wall of any size at other than a Class 3 Residential structure shall be based on \$40. per \$1,000. of the cost of the construction with a minimum fee of \$75.
- 9. The fee for a permit to construct a sign shall be as follows:
  - a. The amount of \$8. Per square feet of the surface area of the sign computed on one side only for double-faced signs. The minimum fee shall; be \$80.
- 10. Photovoltaic Systems, flat fee of \$200.
- 11. Certificates of occupancy.
  - a. The fee for a Certificate of Occupancy granted pursuant to a change of the use group shall be \$174.
  - b. The fee for a Certificate of Continued Occupancy shall be \$174.
  - c. The fee for a Certificate of Occupancy for new construction shall be in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the construction permit fee. Exception: one- and two-family residences less than 5,000 square feet in area and less than 30 feet in height.
    - 1. Minimum fee: \$100.; reinspection fee: \$50.
    - 2. Fee for certificate of continued occupancy: \$120.
    - 3. Fee for certificate of occupancy granted pursuant to a change of use group: \$174.

d. The fee for the first issuance and renewal of a temporary certificate of occupancy shall be \$50.

# B. Elevator subcode fees.

The fee for elevator device inspections and test shall be N.J.A.C.5:23-12, the State Department of Community Affairs shall be the sole enforcing agency.

#### C. Plumbing subcode fees.

For fixtures and equipment, the fees shall be as follows:

- 1. The fee shall be in the amount of \$20. per fixture, piece of equipment, or appliance connected to the plumbing system, and for each appliance connected to the gas piping or oil piping system, except as indicated in 2 below for special devices.
- 2. The fee shall be \$95. per special device for the following: grease traps, oil separators, refrigeration units, water-cooled air-conditioning units, pumps, water or sewer utility service connections, steam boilers, hot water boilers (excluding those for domestic water heating), active solar systems, sewer pumps, and interceptors. There shall be no fee charged for gas service entrances.
- 3. For cross-connections and backflow preventers that are subject to testing requiring reinspection every three months: \$35. for each device when it is tested (thrice annually) and \$100. ror each device when it is broken down and tested (once annually).
- 4. The fee for residential gas piping shall be \$70. and for commercial \$90.
- 5. In any case, minimum fee for any plumbing subcode permit, in part or total: \$80.
- 6. Plan review fee. 25% of the amount to be charged for a new construction plumbing permit as set forth above.

#### D. Electrical subcode fees.

- 1. Minimum fee: \$80.
- 2. Rough wiring (all switches, fixtures, devices, receptacles, sensors, dimmers, alarm devices, smoke and heat detectors, communication outlets, emergency lights, electric signs, exit lights or similar electric fixtures, and devices rated 20 amperes or less including motors and equipment rated at less than one horsepower (1hp) or one kilowatt (1kW) and lighting outlets shall be counted as outlets):
  - a. One (1) to fifty (50) outlets: \$70.
  - b. For each additional 25 outlets or fraction: \$25.
- 3. For each motor or electrical device rated from one horsepower (1 hp) or one kilowatt (1 kW) to ten horsepower (10 hp) or ten kilowatt (10 kW); for each transformer or generator rated from one kilowatt (1kW) or one kilovolt-amps (1 kva); for each replacement or wiring involving one branch circuit or part thereof; for each storable pool or hydro massage bath tub; for each underwater

lighting fixture; for household electric cooking equipment rated up to sixteen kilowatts (16 kW); for each fire, security, or burglar alarm control unit; for each receptacle rated from thirty amperes (30 amps) to fifty amperes (50 amps); for each light standard greater than eight feet (8') in height including luminaries; and for each communications closet, the fee shall be \$40.

- 4. For each motor or electrical device rated from eleven horsepower (11hp) to eleven kilowatts (11 kW) to fifty horsepower (50 hp) or fifty kilowatts (50 kW); for each service equipment, panel board, switch board, switch gear, motor-control center, or disconnecting means rated two-hundred twenty-five amperes (225 amps) or less; for each transformer or generator rated from eleven kilowatts (11 kW) or eleven kilovolt-amps (11 kva) to fifty kilowatts (50 kW) or fifty kilovolt-amps (50 kva); for each electric sign rated from greater than twenty amperes (20 amps) to two-hundred twenty-five amperes (225 amps) including associated disconnecting means; for each receptacle rated greater than fifty amperes (50 amps); and for each utility load management device, the fee shall be \$75.
- 5. For each motor or electrical device rated from greater than fifty-one horsepower (51 hp) or fifty-one kilowatts (51 kW) to one-hundred horsepower (100 hp) or one-hundred kilowatt (100 kW); for each service equipment, panel board, switch board, switch gear, motor-control-center, or disconnecting means rated from greater than two-hundred twenty-five amperes (225 amps) to one-thousand amperes (1000 amps); and for each transformer or generator rated from greater than forty-five kilowatts (45 kW) or forty-five kilovolt-amps (45 kva) to one-hundred twelve and one-half kilowatts (112.5 kW) or one-hundred twelve and one-half kilovolt-amps (112.5 kva), the fee shall be \$139.
- 6. For each motor electrical device rated at greater than one-hundred one horsepower (101 hp) or one-hundred one kilowatts (101 kW); for each service equipment, panel board, switch board, switch gear, motor-control-center, or disconnecting means rated at greater than one-thousand amperes (1,000 amps); for each transformer or generator rated at greater than one-hundred twelve and one-half kilowatts (112.5 kW) or one-hundred twelve and one-half kilovolt-amps (112.5 kva) the fee shall be \$650.
- 7. Fee charged for electrical work for each permanently installed private swimming pool as defined in the building subcode, spa, hot tub. Or fountain shall be a flat fee of \$90., which shall include any required bonding, and associated equipment such as filter pumps, motors, disconnecting means, switches, required receptacles, and heaters, etc., excepting panel board and under water lighting fixtures. For public swimming pools, the fee shall be charged on the basis of the number of electrical fixtures and rating of each electrical device involved in accordance with D, 1-6 above of this section.
- 8. The fee charged for the installation of single and multiple station smoke or heat detectors and fire, burglar, or security alarm systems in any one- or two-family dwelling shall be a flat fee of \$75. per dwelling unit. For fire, burglar, and security alarm systems and detectors in buildings other than one- or two-family dwellings, the fee shall be charged in accordance with A, B and C above.
- 9. The installation consisting of multi-meter stacks, the fee shall be based on the ampere rating of the main bus and not upon the number of meters or rating of disconnects on the meter stack. Individual load side panel boards shall be charged in accordance with 4, 5, or 6 above. There shall be no additional fee charged for the concurrent installation of individual feeder, conductors.

- 10. For motors or similar devices requiring concurrent installation of individual controls, relays and switches, the fee shall be based only upon the rating of the motor or device. There shall be no additional fee charged for the concurrent installation of individual circuit components, for example, controllers, starters, and disconnecting means.
- 11. For electrical work requiring replacement or service entrance conductors or feeder conductors only, or panels, sub-panels, service disconnects, the fee shall be based on the designated ampere rating of the overcurrent of the device of the service or feeder as follows:
  - a. Two-hundred amperes (200 amps) or less, the fee shall be \$100.
  - b. Two-hundred one amperes (201 amps) to one-thousand amperes (1,000 amps), the fee shall be \$150.
  - c. Greater than one-thousand amperes (1,000 amps), the fee shall be \$660.
- 12. The fee charged for process equipment shall be based on the ampere rating of the overcurrent device protecting the conductor feeding the process equipment or the cut off device.
- 13. For the purpose of computing these fees, all electrical and communication devices, utilization equipment and motors which are part of the premises wiring, except those which are portable plugin type shall be counted.
- 14. For photovoltaic systems, the fee shall be based on the designated kilowatt rating of the solar photovoltaic system as follows:
  - a. One kilowatt (1 kW) to one-hundred kilowatts (100 kW), fee is \$200.
  - b. Greater than one-hundred kilowatts (100 kW), the fee is \$700.
- 15. Plan review fee. 25% of the amount to be charged for a new construction electrical permit as set forth above.
- E. Fire protection subcode fees.
  - 1. For fire protection and hazardous equipment, sprinklers, standpipes, detectors (smoke and heat), pre-engineered suppression systems, gas and oil-fired appliances not connected to the plumbing system, kitchen exhaust systems, incinerators, and crematoriums, the minimum permit fee shall be \$80.
  - 2. The fee for sprinklers (wet or dry) or detector heads (smoke or heat) or pull stations shall be as follows:
    - a. For twenty (20) or fewer heads, the fee shall be \$100.
    - b. For twenty-one (21) heads to and including one-hundred (100) heads, the fee shall be \$225.
    - c. For one-hundred one (101) heads to and including two-hundred (200) heads, the fee shall be \$350.

- d. For two-hundred one (201) heads to and including four-hundred (400) heads, the fee shall be \$900.
- e. For four-hundred one (401) heads to and including one-thousand (1,000) heads, the fee shall be \$1,200.
- f. For over one-thousand (1,000) heads the fee shall be \$1,600.
- 3. The fee for each standpipe shall be \$375.
- 4. The fee for each independent pre-engineered system shall be \$175. (Wet chemical, dry chemical, CO2 suppression, foam suppression, FM200 suppression, Ansul system, etc.)
- 5. The fee for each gas or oiled fired appliance that is not connected to the plumbing system shall be \$70.
- 6. The fee for the installation of an above-ground oil tank shall be \$70.
- 7. The fee for each commercial kitchen exhaust system shall be \$175.
- 8. The fee for each crematorium shall be \$550.
- 9. The fee for each incinerator shall be \$550.
- 10. The fee for fire pumps shall be \$200.
- 11. The fee for gasoline and propane tanks, in-ground and above-ground shall be \$95. each.
- 12. The fee for supervisory devices (i.e., tampers, high/low air, etc.) the fee shall be \$20. each.
- 13. The fee for signaling devices (i.e., horns/strobes, bells, etc.) shall be \$20. each.
- 14. The fee for dry pipe alarm and pre-action valves shall be \$70. each.
- 15. The fee for smoke control systems shall be \$85. each.
- 16. Permits for the installation of fireplaces, wood burning stoves and solid fuel burning appliances shall be \$40. per \$1,000. of estimated cost per unit. Minimum fee shall be \$80. per device or appliance.
- 17. Fireplace venting/metal chimney or chimney liner shall be \$80.
- 18. Fee for fire mains to the building shall be \$1.50 per linear foot.
- 19. Fee for fire hydrants shall be \$80. each.
- 20. The fee for fire extinguishers shall be a flat fee of \$50.

- 21. Photovoltaic systems, flat fee of \$80.
- 22. Plan review fee. 25% of the amount to be charged for a new construction fire protection permit as set forth above.

- d. For cross connections and back flow preventers that are subject to re-testing, requiring inspection annually, the fee shall be \$50. for each device.
- 4. The fee for a mechanical inspection in a Use Group R-3 and R-5 structure by a mechanical inspector shall be \$80 for the first device and \$20 for each additional device. No separate fee shall be charged for gas, fuel oil or water piping connections associated with the mechanical equipment inspected.
- G. Annual permit requirements.
  - 1. For charitable, philanthropic, fraternal and religious organizations holding exempt status, the fee shall be 25% of the regular fees to cover the cost of plan reviews, inspections and administration. This does not include the municipal government and the public school district.
  - 2. Prototype for plans already reviewed, those plans processed as Prototype, there will be a discount of twenty percent (20%) of the construction permit. Said prototype plan approvals shall be valid

for the purpose of applying for the new construction permit. When submitting under the Prototype Plan Review, the Construction Code Official shall be notified.

- 3. The fee for annual electrical inspection of swimming pools, spas or hot tubs shall be \$200. The fee for each additional swimming pool, spa, or hot tub on a site shall be \$100.
- H. The construction official shall, with the advice of the subcode officials, prepare and submit to the Mayor and Council, as needed, a report recommending a fee schedule based on the operating expenses of the agency and any other expenses of the borough fairly attributable to the enforcement of the State Uniform Construction Code Act.
- I. State training fees.
  - 1. The fee shall be computed based on the volume of new construction times the current rate set by N.J.A.C. 5:23-4.19 and as amended from time to time.
- 2. The fee for alterations shall be based on the estimated cost of the alterations per thousand for each subcode involved times the fee set by N.J.A.C. and amended from time to time.
- J. All payments to private on-site agencies shall be calculated and paid in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:23-4.18(k) or any amendments or subsequent enactments thereto.
- K. Reinstatement fee.

Whenever a permit shall become void or lapse by definition of N.J.A.C. 5.23, the fee, upon request, and approval of the construction official, may be reinstated at a rate not to exceed seventy-five percent (75%) of the original fee charged. The fee is to be calculated with the use of the current fee schedule, less twenty-five percent (25%) for reinstatement fees.

#### M. Refunds.

Pursuant of N.J.A.C.5:23-2.27, in the case of discontinuance of a building project, the plan review fee and state training fees are not refundable.

- N. Variation fees.
  - The fee for an application for a variation in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:23-2.10 shall be \$820. for Class I structures and \$175. for Class II and Class III structures. The fee for re-submission of an application for a variation shall be \$320. for Class I structures and \$90 for Class II and Class III structures.
- O. Pre-pour concrete inspection fee.

Pre-pour inspection fee for all new concrete flat work, and for replacement of all existing sidewalks a pre-inspection is required prior to pouring the new concrete. The fee for such inspection is fifty dollars (\$50.).

- P. Fire limits.
  - 1. The following fire limits are established pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:23:
    - a. Commercial 1;

- b. Commercial 2;
- c. Special economic development district.
- 2. The construction official shall prepare and submit to the Mayor and Council as needed, a report reevaluating the delineation of the fire limits. This report shall indicate the recommendations of the construction official, the building subcode official and the fire subcode official regarding those areas which should be designated as within fire limits, with reasons therefor.

# Q. Swimming Pools

- 1. Above-ground swimming pools shall be \$175 with a surface area greater than 500sf; the fee in all other cases shall be \$100.
- 2. In-ground swimming pools shall be \$275 with a surface area greater than 500sf; the fee in all other cases shall be \$150.

#### **SECTION 2.**

All Ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith.

#### **SECTION 3.**

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 17.32 "I INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT" OF THE CODE FOR THE BOROUGH OF STRATFORD, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Stratford is a municipal corporation organized and operating under the laws of the State of New Jersey; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Stratford Engineer and Planner has made a recommendation to revise Borough Zoning regarding Industrial Districts; and

**WHEREAS,** in response to the recommendation of the Borough of Stratford Engineer and Planner it is necessary to amend Title 17.32 "I Industrial District",

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** by Mayor and Council of the Borough of Stratford, County of Camden, State of New Jersey that the following is the amended Section 17.32.

#### **SECTION 1.**

Chapter 17.32 of the Code of the Borough of Stratford, entitled "I Industrial District", is hereby amended as follows:

# Chapter 17.32 - I INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT

# **Sections:**

# 17.32.010 - Purpose.

The purpose of the I industrial district shall be to create a zoning district for light industry which will be comparable with the established residential character of the borough and which will contribute to the economic base of the community by providing employment and a market for the business and service uses within the community. Within this zone no lot or building shall be used, and no building shall be erected or altered to be used, in whole or in part unless it complies with the schedule in chapter 17.48 and the following regulations.

(Prior code § 105-50)

#### 17.32.020 - Permitted uses.

The following uses shall be permitted in the I industrial district:

- A. Any business or service use permitted in the C commercial district and the O office district.
- B. Any manufacturing, processing or industrial use listed below, provided that the proposed industrial process meets the performance requirements listed in section 17.32.040 and does not have inherent characteristics which are noxious, injurious, offensive or hazardous to the health, safety or general welfare of the community.
  - 1. Public utility and public maintenance buildings or yards.
  - 2. Manufacturing of materials.
  - 3. Assembly, fabrication, processing, packaging, or treatment of the following previously prepared materials: bone, cork, horn, paper, pharmaceuticals, plastics, metals, stones, wood, tobacco, textiles and perfumes.
  - 4. Food and associated industries.
  - 5. Office buildings for executive or administrative purposes.
  - 6. Experimental, research, biotechnology or testing laboratories and/or educational facilities.
  - 8. In addition to the above, any industry not inconsistent with the above and meeting the performance requirements listed herein may be conducted in this zone. All others are specifically excluded.
- C. Wholesale establishments.
- D. Lumber and building materials and other similar storage yards.

- E. Customary and conventional agricultural uses.
- F. Warehouse, cold storage and distribution centers, provided that a maximum of 2% of the total GFA of principal warehouse use may comprise of accessory retail or showroom space. All warehoused goods are to be stored within a completely enclosed building. The warehousing or storage of bulk (> 10 gallons or > 80 pounds per container) hazardous materials, which are not incident to the normal course of business and in an amount in excess of the maximum allowable quantities under the International Building Code / 2018, as modified by N.J.A.C.5:23-3.14 is prohibited. Permitted is the (i) warehousing or storage of non-bulk hazardous materials incident to the normal course of business and in amounts not in excess of the maximum allowable quantities under the International Building Code / 2018 as modified by N.J.A.C. 5:23-3.14 and which may be modified from time to time in accordance with the Regulations for the New Jersey Uniform Construction Code, N.J.A.C. 5:23-1.1 et seq.; and (ii) storage and use of batteries, lubricants and fuels for warehouse and distribution center material handling equipment (i.e. forklifts). All such warehousing or storage shall be done in compliance and accordance with all federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations, including, but not limited to the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act of 1986, 42 USC 116, et seq. (EPCRA), as may be applicable.

(Prior code § 105-51)

17.32.030 - Prohibited uses.

Although it shall be understood that any use which is not specifically permitted in section 17.32.020 is thereby prohibited, the following uses and activities are specifically prohibited:

- A. Junkyards and automobile wrecking and disassembly yards.
- B. Uses requiring open-air burning.
- C. Uses involving the dissemination of noxious odors and gases.
- D. Foundries, forges and boiler works.
- E. Landfills, chemical waste storage or disposal and bulk storage of petroleum products, natural gas or chemicals.
- F. Any use which utilizes, stores, processes, or disposes of toxic substances which may pose a threat to surface or ground water quality is prohibited. This shall in no way prohibit the use of ordinary household cleaners or chemicals used in the normal course of business.
- G. Underground fuel storage tanks (except as permitted as an ancillary use by State law).

(Prior code § 105-52)

17.32.040 - Performance standards.

Any industrial use in the Borough of Stratford shall adhere to the following standards:

- A. Dissemination of smoke, dust, odors, fumes and other gases shall be within the limits of the industrial tolerance standards of the State Department of Health, Bureau of Adult and Industrial Health.
- B. Liquid wastes and effluents shall be discharged into an approved existing sewage treatment plant in accordance with that plant's regulations, or an industry shall treat its own wastes and effluents in a

treatment plant or process which is in compliance with the state statutes and with the requirements of the State Department of Health.

- C. Precaution against fire hazards, radiation, explosion, proper handling and storage of materials and structural design and safeguards for the health of workers shall comply with the state statutes and requirements of the state department of labor and industry.
- D. No vibration or glare shall be evident at any point more than one hundred fifty (150) feet from the source of said vibration or light.
- E. All permitted uses and accessory activities shall be confined within completely enclosed buildings with the exception of off-street parking, loading and delivery areas, accessory fuel storage, parking for vehicles and construction equipment and the outdoor storage of lumber and building supplies.

17.32.050 - Area and yard requirements.

See chapter 17.64 for buffer strip requirements.

17.32.090 - Design review.

Any construction, alteration, modification or change in the use of a building, structure or lot shall conform to the regulations in the borough's construction code and shall be subject to the review procedures in the borough's development review and land use procedures ordinances.

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF STRATFORD, COUNTY OF CAMDEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, ADOPTING AN AMENDED REDEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR BLOCK 62, LOTS 2, 4, 7 & 18 ON THE OFFICIAL TAX MAP OF THE BOROUGH OF STRATFORD IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE LOCAL REDEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING LAW (N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1, et seq.) ("LRHL")

WHEREAS, the LRHL authorizes municipalities to determine whether certain parcels of land located therein constitute areas in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, by virtue of Resolution Nos. 2016:67 and 2016:103, the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Stratford authorized and directed the Stratford Joint Land Use Board ("JLUB") to undertake the preliminary investigation of property located at Block 62, Lots 2, 4, 7 & 18 ("Study Area") as a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Resolution adopted by the Mayor and Borough Council, the JLUB conducted an investigation to determine whether the Study Area should be designated as an Area in Need of Redevelopment and considered an Area in Need of Redevelopment Study for Block 62, Lots 2, 4, 7 & 18, dated July 2016, prepared by Steven M. Bach, PE, RA, PP, CME and Candace A. Kanaplue, AICP, PP; and

WHEREAS, the JLUB conducted a public hearing on October 4, 2016 concerning the designation of the Study Area as a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area and the meeting was open to the public and all members of the public had an opportunity to address questions and comments to the JLUB; and

WHEREAS, the JLUB prepared a map showing the boundaries of the proposed redevelopment area and the locations of the various parcels and property included therein, including the Study Area appended to the map was a statement setting forth the basis for the investigation; and

WHEREAS, at such public hearing, the JLUB heard sworn testimony from its professional planner who presented substantial credible evidence that Block 62, Lots 2, 4, 7 & 18 qualified as an Area in Need of Redevelopment pursuant to LRHL ("ANR Area"); and

WHEREAS, at the conclusion of the public hearing as described above, the JLUB adopted Resolution No. 16-12, recommending that the Mayor and Borough Council designate the ANR Area on the Official Tax Map of the Borough of Stratford as an Area in Need of Non-Condemnation Redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council agreed with the conclusions of the JLUB that the ANR Area met the aforementioned criteria for Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area designation; and

WHEREAS, by virtue of Resolution No. 2016:108, adopted on August 4, 2016, the Mayor and Borough Council determined that the ANR Area qualified as an Area in Need of Non-Condemnation Redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council have deemed it in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare to adopt an Amended Redevelopment Plan, dated October 6, 2022 as set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof for the ANR Area on the Official Tax Map of the Borough of Stratford.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Stratford, County of Camden, State of New Jersey, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Adoption of an Amended Redevelopment Plan. The Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Stratford, County of Camden and State of New Jersey hereby adopt the Amended Redevelopment

extent of such inconsistency.

**SECTION 5.** If the provisions of any section, subsection, paragraph, subdivision, or clause of this Ordinance

shall be judged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such order of judgment shall not affect or invalidate

the remainder of any section, subsection, paragraph, subdivision, or clause of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 6.** Upon adoption of this Ordinance after public hearing thereon, the Borough Clerk is further directed

to publish notice of the passage thereof and to file a copy of this Ordinance with the County Planning Board, New

Jersey Department of Community Affairs and other agencies as required by law.

**SECTION 7.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication in accordance

# AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF STRATFORD, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING CHAPTER 8.40, ENTITLED "SOLID WASTE REMOVAL," AND CHAPTER 1.12, ENTITLED "FEES," OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF STRATFORD

**WHEREAS,** Chapter 8.4, entitled "Solid Waste Disposal," of the Code of the Borough of Stratford regulates the storage, collection and disposal of garbage, trash and rubbish in order to protect the public safety, health and welfare and to enhance the environment of the people of Stratford; and

**WHEREAS,** Code Enforcement Officer has recommended that Chapter 8.4 be amended to include regulations pertaining to fire safety and street safety of construction dumpsters; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:48-2 the Mayor and Borough Council may make, amend, repeal and enforce such other ordinances, regulations, rules and by-laws not contrary to the laws of this state or of the United States, as it may deem necessary and proper for the good government, order and protection of persons and property, and for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the Borough and its inhabitants; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council deem it in the best interest of the Borough to amend Chapter 8.40 to include the Code Enforcement Officer's recommendations and incorporate additional regulations pertaining to the use of construction dumpsters.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Stratford that the Code of the Borough of Stratford is hereby amended, revised and/or supplemented as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 8.40 of the Code of the Borough of Stratford, entitled "Solid Waste Disposal," is hereby amended, modified and/or supplemented by amending Section 8.40.030, entitled "Administration of provisions," to read as follows:

#### "8.40.030 - Administration of provisions.

Except as otherwise designated in this chapter, the foreman of the Municipal Administrator shall be responsible for the administrative management of this chapter and the rules and regulations authorized."

**SECTION 2.** Chapter 8.40 is hereby further amended, modified and/or supplemented by deleting Subsection F, entitled "Penalties" and amending Subsection D, entitled "Exceptions to prohibitions" of Section 8.40.085, entitled "Containers/dumpsters to be covered; spillage or leakage prohibited," as follows:

- "A. [No Changes].
- B. [No Changes].
- C. [No Changes].
- D. Exceptions to prohibitions.

- 1. Permitted temporary demolition/construction containers.
- 2. to 5. [No Changes].
- E. [No Changes]."

**SECTION 3.** Chapter 8.40 is hereby further amended, modified, and/or supplemented by creating a new Section 8.40.090, to be entitled "Demolition/construction containers," as follows:

#### "8.40.090 - Demolition/construction containers.

- A. For purposes of this chapter, Demolition/construction containers are any containers used in the normal course of demolition or construction for the purpose of storing, containing and/or carting debris for demolition or construction being performed at a property within the Borough of Stratford.
- B. The placement of a demolition/construction containers upon any residential property, sidewalk, street or highway within the Borough of Stratford by persons other than agents or employees of the Borough is hereby prohibited unless:
- 1. Upon a public street, the demolition/construction container is properly illuminated by at least one reflector on each side, such reflector to be at least six inches in diameter so that it is visible at night.
- 2. There is no defect or faulty design in the demolition/construction container which would create a hazard to the general public or damage to a public street.
- 3. The placement of the demolition/construction container which must have the specific approval of the Construction Official of the Borough of Stratford shall not block the flow of vehicular traffic, site views or pedestrian traffic and shall not be loaded in such a manner as to cause its contents to spill onto the street or sidewalk areas.
- 4. The use of the demolition/construction container will not create offensive odors or a health hazard.
- 5. The demolition/construction container is conspicuously marked with the name and address of its owners.
- 6. A permit for the placement of the demolition/construction container is obtained from the Construction Official of the Borough of Stratford pursuant to this chapter, and evidence of such permit is displayed conspicuously on the property of the applicant by means specified by the Construction Code Official.
- 7. In a residential zone, all demolition/construction containers shall be placed on private property unless the placement will not comply with this ordinance or any other ordinance of law of the State of New Jersey. Justification for street placement shall be clear, concise and be subject to review and approval on a case-by case basis.

- C. The movement of a loaded demolition/construction container onto other than construction property or Borough street is prohibited.
- D. Demolition/construction containers shall be placed at least 12 feet away from any combustible structures.
- E. Application for permit. An application for a permit pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be made on forms approved and made available by the Construction Official of the Borough of Stratford. Such application shall include but not be limited to the following information:
- 1. The name, address, and phone number of the applicant and, if applicable, the name and address of the lessor of the demolition/construction container.
- 2. A description or diagram of the location where he proposes to place the demolition/construction container.
- 3. A description of the demolition/construction container which the applicant proposes to place on the sidewalk, street or any other public place of the Borough, which includes the name of the manufacturer, its capacity and a description of the reflectors required by this section.
- 4. The circumstance necessitating the use of the demolition/construction container on a sidewalk, street or public place in the Borough.
- 5. The length of time the applicant plans to place the demolition/construction container on the site, such time not exceeding 30 days.
- F. Issuance of permit. All permits required by this chapter shall be in writing and issued by the Construction Code Official of the Borough of Stratford. The Construction Official shall issue said permit if it appears that the applicant has a reasonable need to use a demolition/construction container for lawful purpose within the Borough. Prior to the issuance of such a permit, the Construction Official shall consult with the Chief of Police to determine that the proposed use of the demolition/construction container shall not constitute a traffic and/or safety hazard. No permits shall be issued until the fee, hereinafter described, shall be paid to the Borough.
- G. The fee payable for a permit pursuant to this chapter shall be as set forth in Chapter 1.12 for each demolition/construction container.
- H. *Insurance*. The owner of the property associated with the use of the container or the contractor arranging use of the container shall provide the Borough with satisfactory proof of liability insurance covering any claims or losses for property damage or personal injury resulting from or occasioned by the placement of the demolition/construction container in an amount not less than \$250,000.

# I. Expiration of permit; renewal.

1. No permit shall be granted by the Construction Official for a term longer than 30 days, although, for good cause shown, a permit previously issued may be renewed for an additional thirty-day period.

2. Upon the expiration of the permit, the permit holder shall remove or cause to be removed the demolition/construction container from the residential property, sidewalk, street or public place.

**SECTION 4.** Chapter 8.40 is hereby further amended, modified, and/or supplemented by renumbering certain sections as follows:

#### "1.12.640 Demolition/construction container permit fees from Section 8.40.090 of Chapter 8.40.

The fee payable for a permit pursuant to this chapter shall be \$50.00 for each demolition/construction container which includes inspections by police, fire and code enforcement."

**SECTION 6.** Except as set forth in Sections 1 through 5 above, the balance of the Code of the Borough of Stratford shall not be affected by this Ordinance.
