**POLICE REPORT**: Chief Ron Morello provided the following report of the Stratford Borough Police Department Activities for March 2025:

During the morning hours, officers responded to a patient's room on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of Jefferson Hospital for a report of a stolen handbag. The victim suspected her daughter had taken the bag the night before during a visit. On our behalf, Gloucester Twp. police went to the daughter's home, and found the daughter was dead of an apparent drug overdose, the handbag was located in the home.

- Based on wind and rainstorm that was passing thru that afternoon, we suggested the public schools initiate an early dismissal, 15 minutes early based on safety concerns of walkers. It went fairly smoothly, getting all the students out and on their way just prior to the windstorm hitting at 3:25pm. It was a close call on whether to dismiss early or not, but it worked out well.
- 3/9 During the afternoon hours, we responded to the bowling alley for a report of a fight brewing involving 50 people. A Special Olympics Event for children was underway, where an autistic older child assaulted a younger child.
  It more or less the one child was triggered by crying and smacked the toddler causing a pretty large disturbance among croups in the crowded bowling alley.
- 3/16 at 4:30am we were called to a burglary in progress on Suburban Terrace. In this case, a drunk neighbor wandered into the wrong house and fell asleep on the couch. No charges were filed.
- 3/14 During the afternoon hours, a male discharged from Jefferson walked down Laurel Road attempted to enter into two stopped vehicles. The male fled on foot and was arrested in the PATCO lot. 40-year-old Camden man was charged with criminal trespassing and tampering with a motor vehicle.
- 3/18 A search warrant was executed on Cornell Avenue seeking weapons and explosives. This incident began with a car stop in Barrington. Assault Firearms and silencers were recovered. Feds?

- 3/19 During the evening hours, we were called to the ER for a report of a suicidal man who climbed onto the upper deck ledge threatening to jump off. Upon arrival, security was holding on to the male and officers were able to wrangle him back onto the parking deck.
