# RESOLUTION 25:101 CERTIFICATION OF ANNUAL MUNICIPAL AUDIT FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2024

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-4 requires the governing body of every local unit to have made an annual audit of its books, accounts and financial transactions; and

**WHEREAS**, the Annual Report of Audit for the year 2024 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Borough of Stratford pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and

**WHEREAS**, R.S. 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall be resolution, certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled "Findings and Questioned Costs" or "Findings and Recommendations"; and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed as a minimum the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "Findings and Questioned Costs" or "Findings and Recommendations", as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the governing body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5; and

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and

**WHEREAS**, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52 – to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52 — A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his/her office."

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Stratford hereby states that it has complied with N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5 and does hereby submit a

# RESCINDING RESOLUTION 25:100 AND ENDORSING THE HOUSING ELEMENT AND FAIR SHARE PLAN ADOPTED BY THE STRATFORD BOROUGH JOINT LAND USE BOARD NUNC PRO TUNC TO JUNE 27, 2025

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2024, Governor Murphy signed P.L. 2024, c.2 into law, which amended the 1985 New Jersey Fair Housing Act; and

**WHEREAS**, for ease in reference, this resolution shall refer to the Fair Housing Act as amended as "FHA II;" and

**WHEREAS**, FHA II established a procedure by which municipalities can secure approval of a Housing Element and Fair Share Plan ("HEFSP") and secure immunity while developing and seeking approval of a HEFSP; and

WHEREAS, that procedure contemplated that municipalities would adopt a resolution by January 31, 2025 committing to a fair share number and filing a declaratory relief action with 48 hours from adoption of the resolution and then filing a HEFSP by June 30, 2025 with the Affordable Housing Dispute Resolution Program (the "Program") within 48 hours of adoption of the HEFSP; and

WHEREAS, the Stratford Borough Council ("Council") asked its affordable housing planning consultant, Leah Furey Bruder, PP, AICP, to prepare a HEFSP to address the Borough's affordable housing obligations under FHA II; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Furey Bruder prepared a HEFSP and the Stratford Borough Joint Land Use Board ("JLUB") adopted the HEFSP which is attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, Council wishes to endorse the HEFSP adopted by the JLUB and seek approval of the HEFSP by the Program and Court.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Stratford, County of Camden, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. Council hereby rescinds Resolution 25:100.
- **2.** Council hereby endorses the HEFSP previously adopted by the JLUB and attached hereto *nunc pro tunc* to June 27, 2025.
- 3. Council hereby directs the Borough's solicitor to (a) file this resolution with the Program, along with any additional documents the professionals deem necessary or desirable; and (b) seek a Compliance Certification from the Program or Vicinage area judge as may be appropriate formally approving the Plan.

(3) Matters Involving Individual Privacy: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including, but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly. (4) Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body. (5) Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds: Any matter involving the purchase, lease, or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed. (6) Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law. (7) Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege:

The topic of discussion is related to Litigation Negotiations and Attorney Client Privilege; Pending

Litigation- Fair Share Housing Center v. Stratford; Laurel Mills LLC v. Stratford;

employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.
(9) Matters Relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty: Any deliberations of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party bears responsibility.
